





## Inspired By Heritage, Designed For Quality Living

A development by Selangor Dredging Berhad, Jui Residences is located adjacent to the Kallang River, on Serangoon Road, Singapore. 117 contemporarily crafted units are found within the 18-storey tower with column-less layouts. The design allows maximum natural lighting and cross-ventilation to flow into the living spaces.

Jui Residences also featured various art-decor heritages through the vertical flutes on the facade, arched detailing to the balconies and white inset curves at the podium. The design elements such as its cement-rendered look for the floor coating at the Sky Terrace are reinterpreted from the 1950s, giving the space an industrial yet contemporary flair. 

The Medelan Italy









Built in one of the oldest parts of the city, The Medelan is named after the first settlement of Celtic Insubres (Celtic villages were called Medhelanon) who, according to modern historians, were the city's founders, traces of which were found underground, just a few steps from The Medelan. The complex is one of the most important buildings of historical and architectural value in Milan, the capital city of Lombardy. It consists of three connected buildings dating back to different time periods: the former headquarters of Credito Italiano, built in 1902-1903, the Magazzini Contratti building, developed in Liberty style, and the wing designed by Giovanni Muzio at the end of the 1950's.







The temple of finance and a building for exclusive use until recently, The Medelan now opens up like a treasure chest holding a precious treasure, hidden and forbidden to most until now. A "treasure" that can finally be experienced within a complex whose external facade remains substantially unaltered as a sign of respect for the building's past history. The image of the treasure chest opening up to the public has inspired a bright vision for the interiors, with golden textures and inserts used in surfaces and finishes. The Medelan stems from the redevelopment of the historical Palazzo Broggi in an exclusive mixed-use building hosting retail, office, Food & Beverage.

Before this renovation, the building was the headquarters of one of the most prestigious Italian banks. Once an institutional and inaccessible place, it has now morphed into a dynamic and flexible reality. On the ground floor are the lobbies, multifunctional environments open to the public, designed to host art exhibitions. From the basement to the first floor are retail spaces designed to be customizable. The upper floors are intended for offices, with a concept that facilitates new forms of socialization and cooperation.

Finally, the rooftop hosts a restaurant with a panoramic terrace and garden where the dome of the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, the spires of the Duomo and Castello Sforzesco seem close enough to touch.



Inside the building complex, the open-air spaces are friendly and stimulating thanks to the greenery that provides well-being and fosters creativity.

The project fits into a broader urban redevelopment project aimed at reviving the relationship with Piazza Cordusio.

The Medelan is a space that opens up to the world, designed to be lived in 24/7, as a cutting-edge landmark in the historical center of Milan. The architect is Stefano Boninsegna of Genius Loci Architettura S.r.l., Italy.



## Vienna calling at Prater Glacis

The hotel project "Prater Glacis - Superbude & Zoku" combines two trendy hotel concepts in the heart of the Austrian capital Vienna. It is part of an ensemble of three buildings that were built over a previously underutilized car park during the Covid-19 pandemic. Finally, a high-quality, sustainable space for urban life was created without any new surface sealing.

With "Prater Glacis", real estate company and owner IG Immobilien developed a new landmark near Messe Wien Exhibition and Congress center and the Vienna University of Economics and Business. Planning and implementation took place in close collaboration with the architectural office Nonconform and the hotel operators of Superbude and Zoku as well as their designers. The building perfectly blends in with the surroundings of Vienna's famous "Prater" fairground. The plot of 9,500 m2, which was previously barely used, now presents itself as a hotspot for vibrant city life.



## Proudly realized during the pandemic

During the project period, monthly planning meetings, regular jour fixes with all stakeholders in building management and all partners were organized, which massively improved the volatile situation during the Covid-19 pandemic. During halftime all workers were honored with a celebration and free-lunch ceremony (under Covid-19 precautions) which was answered with great feedback from the teams on site. After a nerve-wracking rollercoaster ride through multiple lockdowns and changing Covid-19 precaution measures the teams were finally able to celebrate an emotional passway to the neighbourhood with the local communities.








## Hamburg and Amsterdam melting in Vienna

The architecture firm Nonconform designed a striking cube for IG Immobilien, which is now home to two hotel operators with completely different concepts: Superbude from Hamburg scores with a location-based reinterpretation of a hostel, with a wide variety of dens and themed rooms. The furnishings are second-hand from flea markets to follow the idea of maximum sustainability. Amsterdam-based Zoku caters urban nomads with perfectly designed apartments, infrastructure, and a thriving community for combining work and travel. The challenge for the designers was to reconcile the completely different concepts and target groups of the two hotel operators. After a joint trip to the parent companies, several workshops and numerous coordination meetings, a harmonious overall picture was created that now offers room for individuality and presence.









## Sustainability from scratch

To reduce the environmental impact of the project, the building includes a wooden façade. With its vertical garden and building greening the project improves the local microclimate and contributes to the cooling of the whole city-district. The architect is Arch. 

## Malaysia's Pioneer City of Wellness



Setia Eco Templer was built on the belief that there is beauty in all forms of nature. Honouring this notion, the 194-acre former golf course was designed around nine obscure creeks to preserve its primal charm - revolutionised as the project's signature earmark today.

Paying homage to the history of the neighbouring forest reserve, this eco-sanctuary architecturally illustrates a story of three distinctive cultures - English, Peranakan, Balinese - that shaped the Malaysian spirit. Crafted for man and nature to coexist harmoniously in a modern yet timeless fashion, whilst elevating experiences by inspiring meaningful living as a new standard for future generations. The design concept was created by Team Setia in collaboration with Ong & Ong 360 Consultancy Sdn Bhd for the masterplan design and planning.






Kiubo – that is Europe's first mobile apartment.

The realised concept stands for comprehensive sustainable housing of the future, for more quality and efficiency via serial construction, and for affordability according to the needs of the residents. The hybrid system is distinctive, moveable, and flexible.

Kiubo develops homes that grow with life. They adapt to modern needs and lifestyles of the residents. Larger, smaller or somewhere else - Kiubo is unique and flexible. And all this in harmony with the requirements of urban planning.








The Kiubo system is extremely simple. High-quality residential units made of wood (modules) are prefabricated in industrial plants. The modules slot into frame-like structures (terminals) and can be configured in numerous ways. This highly flexible slot-in system allows the modules to be inserted, swapped, connected, extended, removed and reinserted elsewhere.







The Starhemberggasse pilot project was developed and built in Graz, Austria, as the first multi-storey residential building constructed with Kiubo's market-ready system. Architecturally, the building fits in along a building line and defines the public space. The design approach evolved from an urban design through the basic static system of the terminal to the flexible design of the modules depending on the needs of the residents.







After only one year of construction, the result is a five-storey building with a basement for services and generous open spaces throughout the building complex, including a greened flat roof. The 33 prefabricated modules are arranged in 19 units. From the first to fourth floor are the apartments, which were developed in size and combination together with the residents. Starting from a basic module of 25m², this increases to 75m² by combining three designed modules. In addition a common room fronted with a green outdoor sitting area is placed on the first floor. On the other floors, too, generous and greened open spaces are provided for the community. Each residential unit has a private, south-facing outdoor area. In addition, there is a generous ground-level and landscaped area in the courtyard for all residents. The implementation of a lively neighbourhood through the generous design of the common indoor and outdoor areas contributes to the social sustainability of the project. Provincial Highway 9A in northern Taiwan was cut off by a tropical storm in 2015. The Taipei Branch of the Soil and Water Conservation Bureau of the Council of Agriculture of the Executive Yuan rose to the challenge despite the difficulties. From geological hazards surveys to rehabilitation efforts and considering the geological, hydrological and groundwater factors, the agency was working towards the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), "Clean Water and Sanitation," and "Life on Land" by capitalizing on engineering expertise as a powerful arm to rebuild habitats for rare wildlife and a safe route home for local. 

Located in an urban area, the project site is an old cemetery yard and a never-anticipated community park divided by a collector road. Through the installation of the circular "Yi-Wei Ring", this memorial/elevated footbridge allows pedestrians to move freely between the separated spaces, uniting the site as a whole.

The revitalization process has transformed a NIMBY land into a local attraction, which breathes new life into a unique piece of local history. The design redefines the unused open spaces, constructs a landmark for remembrance, and also nurtures a new urban center filled with laughter and collective memories. Located in Beishihsi River, Heya Village, Lugo Township, Nantou County, central Taiwan, The river is about 18.8 kilometers from the east of Lingtou Shan. The long-term scour of water and sediment transportation along the riverbed create staggering erosion marks on the structures and undermine the foundations. The project utilizes Glass Fiber Reinforced Cement (GFRC) rockwall. the boulders in the riverbed and the low height weirs along the river to create the vertical slot fish ladder, and the rock ramp fishway. These structures reduce the stream gradient, and create natural habitats to sustain the biodiversity in the surrounding ecosystem. At same time, these newly constructed structures stabilize the river channel and extend the life-span of the existing structures. The architect is Lin Yung Hsin of CHIEN KUAN Engineering Consultants Co. Ltd., Talwan.



The Heito 1909 project transformed Taiwan's historical sugar factory into a public gathering place, reimagined the wasteland barrier that struck a decade ago, and integrated community resources around the city. Significantly, the park provided people a place to engage in quality natural environments within a metropolitan city. This preservation and adaptive reuse of ruins into the landscape is the first and only in Taiwan. The unique design creatively incorporates the ruins and damaged structures into the urban facility for people to experience.
